ARREST DOCUMENTATION – FOUR ARRESTS RESULTING FROM PSP’S UNLAWFUL CLASSIFICATION

This exhibit contains all arrest-related documents from 2023 through 2024, organized by each arrest event.

Each arrest includes:

- criminal complaints,
- affidavits of probable cause,
- warrants,
- arraignment notices,
- hearing notices,
- dismissal orders,
- court dockets,
- Petitioner’s narrative summaries,
- and medical records where applicable.

F-1 — ARREST #1

December 14, 2023 — “Failure to Register”

F-1A. Criminal Complaint – 12/14/2023

- Charges: Failure to comply with registration requirements.
- Based entirely on PSP’s unlawful classification.
- Contains no judicial basis showing any duty to register.

F-1B. Affidavit of Probable Cause – 12/14/2023

- States Petitioner “failed to appear” for a verification obligation that was never lawfully imposed.
- No mention of any sentencing order or SVP designation.

F-1C. Arrest Warrant – 12/14/2023

- Signed order authorizing arrest solely due to alleged non-compliance.
- Relies on PSP administrative records, not a lawful court order.

F-1D. Preliminary Arraignment — 12/15/2023

- Petitioner held overnight.
- No discussion of underlying legality of registration duty.

F-1E. Conditional Release – 12/15/2023

- Petitioner released approx. **exactly 24 hours** after arrest.

- Petitioner's dog was left without food/water during this period.

F-1F. Court Dockets (MJ-05003-CR-0007185-2023 & CP-02-CR-0001378-2024)

- Docket records show proceedings continued as though registration were lawful.
- Hearings postponed twice because **sheriffs failed to appear**.

F-1G. Narrative Summary by Petitioner

- Sheriffs arrived around 10:15 PM.
 - Petitioner asked "What about my dog?" and was told "You'll be home in 3–4 hours."
 - Sheriffs refused to let Petitioner log out of his work computer.
 - Sheriffs handled Petitioner's **unlocked phone** while handcuffing him.
 - Petitioner returned home **24 hours later**; dog had no food/water.
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F-2 — ARREST #2

April 16, 2024 — "Failure to Appear at Formal Arraignment" (No-Show)

(This arrest involved the taser deployment.)

F-2A. Hospital After-Visit Summary — 04/16/2024

- Confirms taser probes embedded in abdomen.

- Medical removal performed in emergency department.
- Documents physical injury inflicted by sheriffs.

F-2B. Court Docket & Arraignment Notices

- Lists missed formal arraignment.
- **Petitioner asserts he never received proper notice.**

F-2C. Narrative Summary by Petitioner

- Sheriffs **broke into Petitioner's residence.**
 - Sheriffs tased Petitioner before handcuffing.
 - In the van, a sheriff repeatedly yelled:
 “What the f*** is wrong with you?”
 “You child molester!”
 - Petitioner repeatedly told sheriffs he needed medical attention.
 - Neighbor(s) overheard statements outside the van.
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F-3 — ARREST #3

May 2, 2024 — “Failure to Register” (Dismissed)

F-3A. Criminal Complaint — 05/02/2024

- Same allegations as Arrest #1.
- Based entirely on PSP administrative classification.

F-3B. Affidavit of Probable Cause — 05/01/2024

- No court order cited as basis for registration.
- States Petitioner “failed to comply” with a non-existent duty.

F-3C. Arrest Warrant — 05/02/2024

- Second warrant issued for same underlying error.

F-3D. Preliminary Hearing Summary — 05/13/2024 → 06/06/2024

- Hearings repeatedly delayed.
- Charges were **dismissed** on **June 6, 2024**.
- Despite dismissal, Petitioner was held until **June 12, 2024**.

F-3E. Court Dockets (MJ-05003-CR-0002333-2024)

- Shows bail denial and reinstatement.
- Shows dismissal, but also the **additional six days of unlawful detention**.

F-3F. Narrative Summary by Petitioner

- Arrest was sudden and without notice.
- Petitioner detained beyond dismissal date.

- Multiple delays caused by sheriff no-shows.
 - Contributed to financial loss and emotional trauma.
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F-4 — ARREST #4

July 17, 2024 — “Failure to Appear for Trial”

F-4A. Notice of Non-Jury Trial — 07/17/2024

- Petitioner disputes receiving proper notice.

F-4B. Jail Detention Records

- Petitioner held until **October 3, 2024**.
- Placed on suicide watch with lights on 24/7 for days.
- Denied phone access for approx. **one week**.

F-4C. Court Dockets

- Show extended detention.
- Reflect sheriff execution of warrant.

F-4D. Missing / Stolen Property Summary

- After release, Petitioner returned home to discover:
 - House left unsecured

- Over **\$9,098.29+** in belongings missing (electronics, tools, valuables, new iPhone 15 Pro Max, etc.)

F-4E. Narrative Summary by Petitioner

Forced Entry & Threats:

- Petitioner told sheriffs he was naked and dressing.
- Female sheriff: “OK.”
- Sheriffs **broke in anyway.**
- Male sheriff forced Petitioner down stairs and through home saying:
“You ain’t seen aggression yet.”
- During transport, male sheriff yelled:
“Sit the f*** down.”

Cell Conditions:

- Suicide watch despite no self-harm statements.
- Light never turned off for days.
- Not allowed a phone call for a week.
- Detained for nearly **three months.**

F-5 — Summary Conclusion (Exhibit F)

All four arrests were triggered by PSP's unlawful administrative classification, not a lawful court order.

This exhibit supports claims of:

- Due process violations
- Ultra vires agency action
- False imprisonment
- Excessive force
- Ex Post Facto violations
- Equal protection violations
- Continuing harm
