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#### G-1. Source Document

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#### G-2. Summary of Medical Findings

- Petitioner was brought to the Emergency Department **in police custody**.
  - Petitioner had **two taser probes** embedded in the **abdomen**.
  - Medical staff confirmed injuries consistent with **electrical stun device** deployment.
  - Taser barbs were surgically **removed** in the emergency room.
  - Wound care instructions were provided.
  - Documentation includes physical examination notes and treatment details.
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### G-3. Relevance to Petition

This exhibit confirms:

1. **Use of force** was significant and caused bodily injury.
  2. The taser deployment occurred **inside Petitioner's home** during a forced-entry arrest.
  3. Petitioner required **emergency medical treatment**.
  4. The arrest and injury stemmed from PSP's **unlawful classification**, not from any independent criminal conduct.
  5. The event contributed to:
    - o physical pain,
    - o emotional trauma,
    - o humiliation (in presence of neighbors),
    - o financial cost,
    - o and disruption of employment.
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### G-4. Incident Context

*(From Exhibit F narrative)*

- Sheriffs forcibly entered Petitioner's home.
- Petitioner was tased prior to being secured.
- While restrained and inside the police van, a deputy yelled:  
  
    “What the f\*\*\* is wrong with you?”  
  
    “You child molester!”

- Statements were overheard by neighbors.
  - Petitioner repeatedly informed deputies he needed to go to a hospital.
  - Taser probes remained embedded until hospital removal.
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#### **G-5. Conclusion (Exhibit G)**

**Exhibit G provides medical confirmation of injuries inflicted by law enforcement during an arrest that resulted solely from PSP's unlawful registry classification.**

This exhibit supports claims of:

- excessive force,
- unlawful arrest,
- due process violations,
- physical injury,
- and ongoing harm.
