These incidents do *not* directly involve PSP Megan’s Law classification, but they help illustrate **patterns**, **timelines**, **stressors**, and **environmental factors** that may be relevant to:

- Petitioner’s mental/physical health
 - Law enforcement interactions
 - Home safety
 - External pressures impacting Petitioner’s life
 - Potential background context for later misconduct by authorities
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K-A — HOME INCIDENTS & UNUSUAL EVENTS

K-A-1 — Water Intrusion / Plumbing Issue (“Pipe Replacement” Video)

Summary:

- Petitioner documented water leaking from a second-floor bathtub spigot.
 - Communicated with landlord/management (Justin) regarding repairs.
 - This incident contributed to home instability and stress during the same period as arrests and investigations.
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K-A-2 — Photograph: Water Damage from Bathtub

Summary:

- Photo shows water dripping from above, consistent with leaking plumbing.
- Demonstrates physical deterioration inside Petitioner’s residence.
- Important context for environmental stress and repair issues.

K-A-3 — PWSA Water Lead Test Results

Summary:

- Petitioner submitted water samples for lead testing.
 - Documentation shows concern regarding potential contaminants, safety, and health risks in the home.
 - Reinforces the environmental stress Petitioner faced during the timeframe of escalating sheriff involvement.
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K-B — MEDICAL / PSYCHOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

K-B-1 — 2016 Neuropsychological Evaluation

Summary:

- Comprehensive neuropsychological examination.
- Identifies psychological vulnerabilities, trauma history, stress responses, and cognitive effects.

- These findings may explain:
 - increased vulnerability during police interactions
 - heightened trauma during unlawful arrests
 - cumulative harm resulting from PSP and sheriff actions
 - This report **supports the damages section** of the Petition.
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K-C — “CONTINUITY OF EVENTS”

CONTEXT

These “possibly related” items all share three themes:

1. They occurred within the same timeframe that:

- PSP continued treating Petitioner as a registrant
- Attorney representation failed
- Arrests escalated
- Sheriffs increasingly appeared at the residence

2. They demonstrate external instability that amplified harm caused by unlawful classification:

- Home repairs
- Water damage

- Environmental hazards
- Psychological stress
- Surprising or repeated law enforcement entries

3. They reinforce the Petition’s damages narrative:

- Emotional distress
- Physical and environmental instability
- Chronic stress
- Interference with normal life
- Compounded vulnerabilities

These issues do *not* create new claims by themselves —

instead, they **contextualize the broader impact** of PSP’s unlawful conduct.

K-D — Summary Conclusion (Exhibit K)

Exhibit K documents various environmental, psychological, and home-related events that, while not direct causes of Petitioner’s legal

**problems, provide important context
demonstrating cumulative stress,
vulnerability, and disruption coinciding with
PSP and sheriff misconduct.**
